
## TIPS FOR READING

HEINREICH MANN (1871-1950)

- Read to your child as often as possible.
- Talk about the book before you read- discuss the cover, make a guess about what the story may be about, point out the title and who the author is.
- After reading talk about your favourite moment, favourite character, the pictures, what was your favourite picture, did the story remind you of any other books you have read.
- When appropriate over time introduce words like illustrations, author etc.

- When reading together try to do it in a quite but comfortable place.
- Vary the types of books you read together.
- Sometimes children who may begin to struggle with reading can benefit from listening to stories, maybe on CD or the internet as they follow along with the book.

- As children progress to recognising more words they can read with you.
- Let the child read the words they know and if they reach a word they are unsure the parent should take over reading.
- Join the library- it's a much cheaper way of keeping your child in reading material.

## BENEFITS OF READING TOGETHER

 Reading and talking about reading/books helps develop oral language skills and a wide bank of vocabulary.

 It improves listening skills and concentration.

 Reading develops imagination and creativity which benefits writing later on in school.
